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Online mp4 to gif converter

By Alexis Lawrence When you download MP4 files from paid download and sharing of copyrighted music, but this protection also makes it difficult for people who have paid for and legally downloaded the music to utilize the files anywhere other than on their computer, including on portable media devices such as MP3 players and cell phones. If you want to make the files usable in these devices, you will have to get past the copy-protection. Create a playlist of the protected songs that you would like to convert. ITunes allows the burning of protected MP4s to disc. If the playlist is longer than 74 minutes, which is the time limit on CD-Rs, iTunes will give you the option to burn the playlist onto more than one disc. Highlight the playlist. This will make the "Burn Disc" button visible at the top of the screen. Click the "Burn Disc" button. Insert a blank disc into your computer's CD drive. When you click the "Burn Disc" button, iTunes will automatically prompt you to insert a disc. Click the "Burn Disc" button again. The iTunes player will prompt you with a pop-up message that says to click the button again to burn the files to disc. A progress bar will appear at the top of the screen and show the status of the disc-burning. It will also show the estimated time remaining. When the disc is done writing, leave the disc in the computer. Download the CD Master and wait for the software (see Resources). Follow the prompts to install CD Master to your computer drive. This may take a minute or two. If CD Master doesn't recognize the CD, eject the disc and insert it again. Go to the "Record" menu and select "CD Ripper" from the menu options. Select the output file type and output folder of your choice. CD Master can convert protected MP4s into WAV, OGG or MP3. You will be able to browse your system for the folder where you would like to save the files. Use the "Move all" arrow to transfer all of the audio files on the CD to the list to be converted. Click "OK" and the conversion process will begin. Progress will be monitored on the CD Master screen. Once the conversion is complete, the unprotected WAV, OGG or MP3 files will be available in the folder you chose for file output. When you're dealing with subtitles on an audio or video track, an MKV file can come in handy. When it's time to convert an MKV file into something your device will support, like an MP4 file, it's important to make sure you follow these steps to prevent any video format, including MKV. Better yet, it can also convert them to something more universal, like MP4. Here's how. Step 1: Head over to VideoLAN's website and download VLC. Make sure to read the fine print when installing, so you aren't introducing your computer to any bloatware. Step 2: Open the software and click the Media tab in the upper-left corner and select Convert/Save from the resulting drop-down menu. Step 3: Click the Add button and locate the file you wish to convert on your PC. Once it's selected, press the Convert/Save button at the bottom of the window. Step 4: Specify your desired video format — in this case, we'd recommend H.264 + Mp3 (MP4) — using the drop-down menu beside Profile. Clicking the tool icon (next to the drop-down menu) will also allow you to further fine-tune your settings. Step 5: Specify under Destination where you would like VLC to export your file. Then, click Start. The timeline will turn into a progress bar and once it finishes, your video will be ready. Remember that the old MKV file still exists. If you no longer want the old file and would prefer more storage space on your computer, you should delete all your old MKV files when finished. CloudConvert (web-based) screenshot Fortunately, you don't have to rely on software to convert your files. Instead, you can use a web service to do the work for you. There are plenty to choose from, but we think CloudConvert is the best. It's simple and supports a wide variety of file formats. It's a hosted service, so you'll have to upload your video files to their server. You may have privacy concerns, and if you do, you can simply use software to edit them on your own device. Otherwise, you have the choice to immediately delete your file as soon as it converts. Just click on the X icon next to the Download button to do so. Be warned that it can take up to 24 hours, but your videos should be deleted from their servers permanently. After the installation, open the app and click the Add or Drag File(s) button on the screen. screenshot A pop-up window will appear where you can select the MP4 file as the input. It's often easier or even necessary to convert them to something more usable, like MP4. Luckily, that conversion is easy to do. Note: We're using macOS for our examples and screenshots in this article, but all the apps we're using here work pretty much identically on Windows. What are MKV Files, and Why Should I Convert Them? MKV is not a video format. Instead, it's a multimedia container format used to combine different elements like audio, video, and subtitles into a single file. That means you could use any video encoding you want in an MKV file and How Do You Play Them? The problem arises with compatibility. Not every device or video app can play MKV files, and that's especially true on mobile devices. MKV is open source, and not an industry standard, so it doesn't have support on many devices. It won't even work in Windows Media Player or Quicktime, the defaults for Windows and macOS. The solution: Convert your MKV files to MP4 is compatible with most devices and apps, and you won't lose much quality (if any) to the conversion process. The Simplest Solution: Use VLC VLC is an open source media player, one of the few that can play MKV, but it also has a hidden option (or "Convert / Stream" option (or "Convert / Save" on Windows). This doesn't automatically convert what you're watching, so you'll have to drag the file into the window again. Afterward, you can choose the file format you want to use for saving; VLC supports most formats, but MP4 is the default. After selecting the format you want, just hit the "Save" button and select where you want to save the new file. A More Full-Featured Solution: WinX Video Converter While VLC performs a simple encode on a single file, there's a lot more under the hood that you might want to control if you're doing any video production work. For this, WinX VideoProc handles the job well. When you open it up, switch to the "Video" tab at the bottom, and the first screen you see asks you to drag media onto it. Drag your file in, and the rest of the controls will pop up. You can also add entire folders of videos and bulk encode them all at once, but we'll stick to a single video for now. Again, the default conversion option is MP4, so we don't have to change much there, but if you want to take a peek under the hood, you can double-click the profile to change the settings. From here you can change many options, the notable ones being: Image quality, to adjust the quality in each frame, and the encoding speed Bitrate, to make files smaller at the cost of quality Framerate, to convert down to 30 or 24fps video Resolution and aspect ratio There are also audio codec options, but audio makes up such a small part of the video it's worth keeping it on high settings. Once you're done configuring, you can hit "Run" to start the conversion. Video conversion can take a while, especially with larger videos, but when it's done the app will automatically open up the folder where it saved your files. Open Source Alternatives WinX is shareware, and while you can do a lot of things with the trial version, the full app is locked down unless you pay for the premium version. If you want the same level of customization for free, it's worth trying Handbrake. Handbrake is a little more streamlined, but its interface can be a bit confusing. Handbrake has a nice queue for lining up multiple encodes but doesn't have the same option to encode entire folders as WinX does. However, you can add multiple files individually, and then add them all to the queue.
