We use active voice when the focus is on the person or thing that performs the action. Read the sentence given below. Sita drew a picture on the wall. Here the focus is on Sita who performs the action of drawing on the wall. The same idea can be expressed in another way. A picture was drawn on the wall by Sita. / A picture was drawn by Sita on the wall. More examples are given below. My sister writes short stories. (Active voice) Short stories are written by my sister. Verbs are either active or passive in voice. In the active voice, the subject is the do-er of the action. In the passive voice, the subject is not the do-er of the action. It is shown with 'by + do-er' or is not shown in the sentence. Passive voice is used when the action is the focus, not the subject. For Example: The government built a new bridge. (Active Voice) A new bridge was built by the government. (Passive Voice) One can easily rewrite an active sentence to a passive sentence. The object in the active sentence becomes a subject in the passive sentence. The verb is changed to a "be" verb + past participle. The subject of the active sentence follows by or is omitted. For Example: The director will give you instructions. (Active Voice) Instructions will be given to you by the director. (Passive Voice) Assertive Sentences / Declarative Sentences contain statements. They state or declare something. If the statement has a 'yes' sense, it is an affirmative sentence and, if the statement makes a negative sense, it is a negative sentence. Everyone will blame us. (Active Voice) We will be blamed by everyone. (Passive Voice) Interrogative Sentences are sentences that ask a question. The question form is maintained in the Passive voice. This means that the first auxiliary of the verb is placed before the subject. The Modals (may, might, can, could, will, would, etc.) follow the same pattern. Could Neha lock the door? (Active Voice) Could the door be locked by Neha? (Passive Voice) Imperative sentences give a direct command. It can end in a full stop or an exclamation mark, depending on the forcefulness of the command. In Active Voice- The subject 'YOU' is generally not expressed but understood. In Passive Voice- The subject 'YOU' is expressed and is then followed by the verb 'are ordered, are requested, are advised, are required' or such verb that suits the sense. 'To' is added to the verb appearing in the active voice. In some cases the word 'let' is used to introduce the passive sentence and 'be' is put before the past participle. For Example: Carry it home. (Active Voice) Let it be carried home. (Passive Voice) Typical Sentences For Example: Rose smells sweet. (Active Voice) Rose is sweet when smelt. (Passive Voice) Special type of sentences: Sentences where prepositions other than 'by' are used with the object. Flood water fills the town. (Active Voice) The town is filled with the flood water. (Passive Voice) In sentences with two clauses, both the clauses are changed into Passive: The neighbour asked the boy / why he broke the glass. (Active Voice) The boy was asked by the neighbour / why the glass was broken by him. Consider the following sentences : Lata sings a song. A song is sung by Lata. There is practically no difference in the meanings of these two sentences. These are two different ways of presenting the same thing. But in the first sentence the Subject performs the action while in the second sentence, the Subject of the Verb is acted upon. Thus, the voice shows whether the Subject of a Verb acts or is acted upon. Active Voice : When the Subject of a Verb acts, the Verb is said to be in the Active Voice ; as— I made a mistake. Passive Voice : When the object of the Active Voice becomes the Subject, the Verb is said to be in the Passive Voice , as— A mistake was made by me. The Subject dominates in Active Voice but the Object dominates in Passive Voice. Note. It is only the form of the verb in a sentence which shows whether the subject is the door or the receiver of the action. A sentence in passive voice may or may not have the 'by' phrase attached. Thus in the above sentences, 'A mistake was made' is a complete sentence. 2. Rules for changing a Verb from the Active Voice into the Passive Voice : 1. The object of the Active Verb is made the Subject of the Passive Verb. 2. The Subject of the Active Verb is made the object of some Preposition (generally 'by'). 3. The Verb of the Active Voice gets the Past Participle form of the Finite Verb and some form of the verb 'to be' (be, is, am, are, has been, have been, was, were, had been, will be, is being, will have been, etc.) will be used before it in the passive voice. 4. Some vague and indefinite subjects like 'everyone', 'they', 'people', 'someone', 'somebody', 'everybody', 'anybody', etc. are dropped if they are the subjects of the active voice. If so, the preposition 'by' is also not used. 5. The Tense of the Verb does not change. Example: He has done his work. (Active) His work has been done by him. (Passive) 3. The Pronouns (when these act as subject) are changed as given below: Subject Object I becomes me We becomes us You becomes you She becomes her He becomes him They becomes them It becomes it Who becomes whom 4.
